Homeschool Transfer Policy

According to North Carolina Law (G.S.115C-557), each qualified nonpublic school shall administer, at least once in each school year, a nationally standardized test or other nationally standardized equivalent measurement selected by the chief administrative officer of such school, to all students enrolled or regularly attending grades three, six and nine. **The nationally standardized test or other equivalent measurement selected must measure achievement in the areas of English grammar, reading, spelling and mathematics.** Each school shall make and maintain records of the results achieved by its students. For one year after the testing, all records shall be made available, subject to G.S. 115C-174.13, at the principal office of such school, at all reasonable times, for annual inspection by a duly authorized representative of the State of North Carolina. Applicant must provide Davidson Charter Academy the results of the most recent standardized testing by **July 1st** prior to the year of enrollment. A best approach is to submit testing information along with the lottery application to ensure accurate grade level applications. Failure to submit these required documents would constitute an incomplete enrollment packet and the school reserves the right to remove the student from the enrollment roster.

The Director of Education has the right to place the student where they can best be served. (G.S. 115C-288(a)). If test scores from a nationally standardized test or equivalent measure that are adequate to determine proper grade placement are provided, the Director of Education will not require further testing for placement purposes. If it is found that the tests submitted are not valid based on evidence presented by the parent/legal guardians, and/or test administrators, the Director of Education may require additional testing.

Davidson Charter Academy relies upon accurate and truthful information on the application forms. If a parent/legal guardian provides false or incorrect information on the application, such as but not limited to providing an incorrect grade level, the application will be considered invalid, and the student will be deemed ineligible for admission.
